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THIS BOOK began as a doctoral thesis; its roots go back a dozen years or more. A NOTE ON USAGE

THE AGE OF GRACE is intended to be accessible to readers without training in Greek as well as to classicists. I have therefore transliterated Greek words when they appear in the text and translated them when they first occur. The principal words can also be found in the glossary. In the notes, however, particularly when the discussion is of a philological nature, I have used the untransliterated Greek. My regular practice has been to use the Latinized version of Greek proper names, unless the Greek version is in common use.
