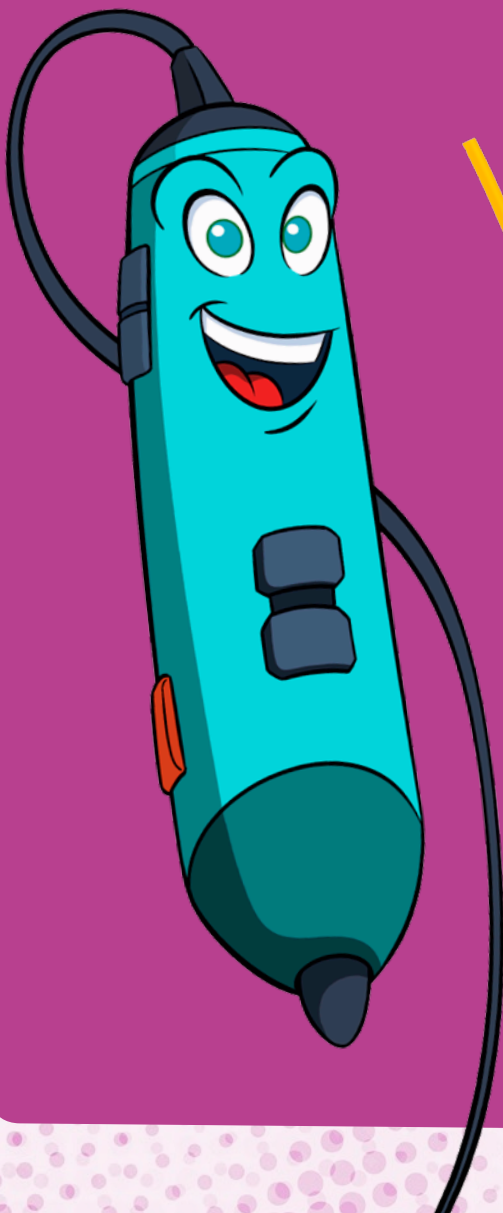

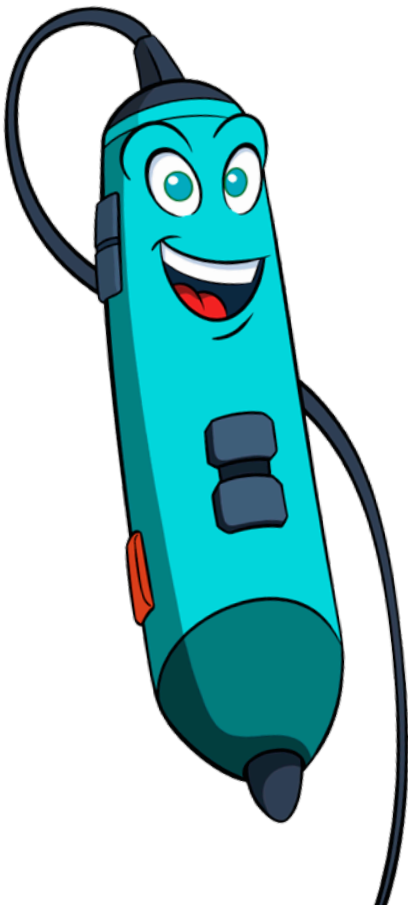

Drawing with pen and paper is fun. But if you want to amp up your art, a 3D pen is the way to go. A 3D pen works like a normal pen. But there's one major difference – it uses plastic filament instead of ink.

3D drawing allows you to create projects that really do jump off the page. Instead of using computers and mechanics to make 3D designs, these pens allow users to draw freehand. They can make models of designs quickly and cheaply. Artists, engineers, architects, jewellery makers and other craftsmen and -women find them useful.
