
INTRODUCTION By gore verbinsky



In 2001 Guy Delisle was allowed into North Korea to work on an animated cartoon. As an animator, Guy has a unique talent to "see" things as an assembly of moments or frames, manufacturing motion and emotion on a strange cellular level. "Key frames" may be the instances in life where things happen: the events and memories, the highlights reel if you will. But as Guy's writing continues to show us, that is not how life actually works. We exist, in the "in-betweens." Observing the human condition in a strange land with a skill set uniquely suited to convey the absurdity of the mundane. Guy reduces the amplitude to get underneath the narrative and break down a belief system into something infinitely relatable. He deceptively penetrates that impenetrable interior, and brings us a hypnotic and unnerving look at the daily life of those who visit and exist in a bubble of fear. The mind is extraordinary, and belief systems, most of all, are what mold us over time. By taking us into the rabbit hole we see that contrast immediately, but by living there and existing, he is making us aware of the systems that shape us as well. During his two month stay in North Korea, Guy Delisle was caught in the "tweens"-drifting between beacons—and we are the beneficiaries. As he shares with us that experience through a granularity and point of view that continue to make his work so absolutely essential.




