

FOREWORD

by

FIELD MARSHAL SIR GERALD TEMPLER, K.G.

This is a bibliography for students of military history. It is not intended as a book for the general reader. There has never been anything like it before, though it has been badly wanted for years. For the author, or perhaps compiler would be the better word, it has been a labour of love stretching over a long period. For thirty-seven years, Mr. Arthur Sharpin White served in the War Office Library, and for eleven years he was its Librarian. Indeed his heart lay in his work and he, together with his predecessors and his successor, played a major part in building up this Library. Now known as the Ministry of Defence (Central and Army) Library, it contains some 360,000 separate items and is, I believe, the largest library in the United Kingdom devoted to a single subject.

The publication of this work will introduce to Librarians, both at home and abroad, the very considerable literature dealing with the Regiments and Corps of the British Army, information that has not previously been readily available. It has been sponsored by the Society for Army Historical Research of which Mr. White, now one of its Vice-Presidents, was a Founder-Member and for thirty-one years the Honorary Secretary.

It is right to record that the publication has been made possible by the provision of financial assistance by the Army Museums Ogilby Trust, which was set up by the late Colonel R. J. L. Ogilby, in 1954, to promote and foster Regimental Tradition. Colonel Ogilby was a Vice-President of the Society, and for many years Chairman of its Council.

The long and distinguished history of the British Army is an amalgam of its component parts—its Corps and Regiments—whether they have been disbanded or merged over the years, or whether they exist to-day in their original guise or in some new form.

Long may devotion to those Corps and Regiments continue. Without that devotion, the Army would lose something quite irreplaceable, as other Armies in the modern world have found.

PREFACE

WITH the large increase in the number of regimental histories that have appeared during the past half century the need for a bibliography has become more and more apparent. I began collecting material over thirty years ago, mainly for my own use. Now owing to the recent reorganization and amalgamations of regiments the time would seem appropriate for the production of such a work.

Mention should be made of two articles in the Journal of the Society for Army Historical Research which partly cover the field, *Militia Regiments of Great Britain; a Calendar of their Records and Histories* (1933) by the late Lt.-Col. J. H. Leslie and *A Bibliography of Volunteering* (1945) by Mr. Ernest J. Martin and the present compiler.

As with most bibliographies the problem has been what to include. In order to keep within reasonable limits autobiographies, recruiting brochures (largely advertisements), regimental journals, and items of more or less ephemeral interest have been excluded.

For the Regular Army the order adopted is roughly that in which the regiments are shewn in the Army List before the recent amalgamations, the pre-amalgamation titles being used. Current titles are given in the Appendix (the disbanded Irish regiments are included in their order of precedence). Then follow, in separate groups, Fencibles; Militia; Yeomanry; and Volunteers and Territorial Army units arranged under counties; Women's Corps; Disbanded Regiments and Corps; Colonials and Provincials; Foreign Corps in British Service; ending with the Royal Marines; and Body Guards.

In the text, square brackets [] are used to denote information not found on the title-page. The term 'plates' is used to describe illustrations inset on unnumbered pages and the size is given in inches. In a few cases where full details are not given, the item has been taken from a catalogue but I have been unable to see a copy. The usual abbreviations of military ranks have been used and all decorations omitted.

My grateful thanks are due to Mr. D. W. King, Librarian, Ministry of Defence (Central and Army) and Mr. R. T. Eldridge, Assistant Librarian, for their generous assistance and to the Army Museums Ogilby Trust for making publication possible.
