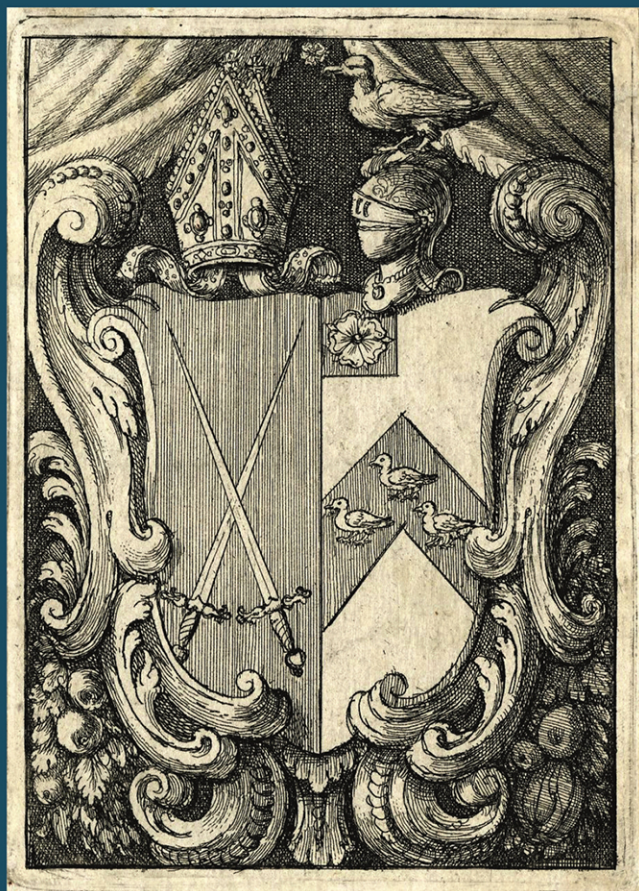

Exempt parishes

Certain parishes in the diocese were exempt from the jurisdiction of the archdeacon. Churchill attributes the exemptions, in the twelfth century or before, to the collation of their incumbents by the archbishop, archiepiscopal residences in their parishes or incumbents' occupation of 'posts in the Archbishop's administrative economy too important for their subjection to be suitable'.¹ The number of exempt parishes varies according to the source. The table below compares the number of exempt parishes shown in the Catalogue with those enumerated by Nicolas Battely and with those described by William Somner for Archdeacon Sancroft in 1668. The Lambeth Palace Library website in 2022 gives a different, probably later, list. The privilege of exemption was abolished in the nineteenth century.
