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
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will try to talk about actions Ι and consequences from my field of work: this determines my experience and my point of view. The reader, for his part, must bear in mind that these cannot be separated from the entries in my passport - nationality, date of birth, place of birth, physical characteristics, the color of eyes, and signature. They are also inseparable from the present date. This is a picture of the author at the moment of writing: he is searching and groping within a decaying and unfolding theatre. With the continuation of my work, every experience takes away the conclusiveness of these keys. It is impossible to calculate the function of a book - but I hope that this will prove useful at some point for everyone who has to wrestle with their own problems related to a different time and place. But if someone wanted to use it as a manual, I can only warn him - there are no formulas, there are no methods. I can describe an exercise or a technique, but anyone who tries to reproduce it according to my description will surely be disappointed. I would teach anyone, without further ado, everything I know about theatre rules and techniques in a few hours. The rest is practice - and that can only be acquired by yourself. All we can do is try to do.
